CONDUCTING A FRAUD CHECK-UP

Be Aware. Assess your risk of financial fraud.

We all know the importance of maintaining one's health. For most of us, that means having an annual check-up. The same can be said for maintaining your financial health. For that, you need to assess your risk of financial fraud by performing a fraud check-up.

IF YOU USE DEBIT OR CREDIT CARDS

- Never use obvious "PIN's" (such as 1234 or 0000), your birthdate or address.
- Use caution entering your PIN number.
- Check your statement when it arrives and be sure to investigate if it's late.
- Shred hard copy credit card information.

IF YOU USE A COMPUTER

- Never use weak or obvious passwords such as 123456 or the word "password".
- Change your wifi router password from the factory setting.
- Avoid using public wifi networks to conduct financial transactions.
- Ensure that you use a robust firewall with the latest "definitions" for the anti-virus software and keep it updated.
- Never open emails from sources you don't know or trust. Delete them instead.

Once you've assessed your risk of fraud, it's time to correct your mistakes and conduct a purse/wallet tune-up.

CONDUCT PURSE/WALLET TUNE-UP

- Take out any items that you don't need and/or regularly use including:
 - any debit or credit card that you haven't used in the last three months:
 - your Social Insurance card (Note: only an employer can demand to see it); and
 - birth "certificate".
- Photocopy the remaining cards/pieces of ID front and back and store it in a safe place in the event that they are lost and stolen.
- 3. Never write down PIN numbers then carry them in your wallet. Store these where it's safe.

MINIMIZING THE CHANCE FOR LOSS

A thief only needs a second to steal your purse. Never leave your purse or wallet visible and unattended in your vehicle, a shopping cart, restaurant, a movie theatre or in your workplace. Place it out of sight or maintain direct control.
